Words relating to 'servant' or 'service' are the Harnham Junior School Christian Value which we are encouraging families to explore this term.



Living a life of service is about keeping your eyes open and looking out for ways to make others smile.


Draw a large smiley snail.




OBE Award

The OBE, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, is an honour and medal awarded to people who have **served** their country or local community, often as volunteers.

- the first honours were awarded by George V in 1917 to people who had served their country in World War 1 but were not soldiers
- · over 800 OBEs are now given each year
- . OBEs are awarded for service such as:
 - o helping disabled children and their families
 - o working on nature conservation projects
 - o bringing relief to carers of very sick relatives
 - o protecting and caring for our country's important buildings

o providing animal welfare





THALL OF FAME

JK Rowling OBE

Joanne K Rowling is best known for writing the series of fictional novels about Harry Potter, stories which captured the imagination of children across the world. She was awarded the OBE for



her "services to children's literature".

JK Rowling wanted to use some of the money she had earned from her books to help orphaned children in Eastern Europe, she founded The Lumos Foundation and funded work to transform the lives of disadvantaged children living in huge, poorly funded orphanages. With her help beautiful, well equipped homes have been established, run by foster parents who love and care for young children.

Jesus explained what service was- not just in words but in actions.

Feet, in the time when Jesus lived, were often very dirty and sweaty! Can you imagine living in a dusty hot land where walking was the main way of getting from one place to another? There were no buses or cars! When a guest entered a house, the first thing that happened was that the servant would wash their feet.

When the followers of Jesus gathered to eat together, Jesus took off his outer robes and he knelt down and washed the feet of his disciples. Even though Jesus was in charge he decided to serve them. This turned upside down the normal relationship between master and disciple, leader and follower. It was a sign of his love for them. He told them to follow a new command to 'Love one another' as he loved them. Love is given humbly and needed to be received by them.

Perhaps it would be like if you were a follower of The Queen or Taylor Swift or Lionel Messi and you received a letter from them inviting you to tea. When you arrived at their mansions in welly boots they would help you by washing your wellies and afterwards they would invite you to sit down so that they could kneel down and wash your feet and dry them!!!
