

Language Festival

Tuesday saw the return of our Language Festival in celebration of European Day of Languages. Children and parents, who can speak a second language, were invited to run stands to teach others how to say key words and phrases. All year groups visited the festival for their chance to learn Filipino, Malayalam, Marathi, Nepali, Chinese, Polish, Ukrainian or Fijian to name a few! In total, we had 17 different languages represented. Thank you to all who volunteered their time to make this event a huge success.

What has been happening in School this week?...

Year 3

As part of our history topic, The Stone Age, Year 3 have been looking at Chronology. We created a timeline for ourselves and then looked at where the Stone Age fits in to our class timeline, from pre-historic times all the way up to the present day. We are very excited to be heading off to Stonehenge next week. Did you know Stonehenge was begun about 5000 years ago?

This week, Cedar class have been learning about balanced diets, in Science.

Year 4

This week Year 4 have been continuing writing their letter. They created some 'old' letters by tea staining them, ready to publish their letters later on this week. In maths, they have been working on their place value - specifically looking at rounding to 10, 100 and 1000. In PSHE we have been looking at different roles in the School Community and how they help us learn. In PE, we have been practising our passing and dribbling skills in mini games of football.

Year 5

This week Ash class have started to learn about writing a biography. We have looked at technical language, subordinate clauses and gathered research about Sir David Attenborough. Later in the newsletter is work from Emilia, Jude, Tosin, Alyna and Dora.

Year 6

In Birch Class, we developed our rugby skills by scoring tries and weaving around cones, at speed, whilst carrying the ball.

We made colour spinners for the next step in our Science learning. These demonstrated how white light is a combination of all the colours in the rainbow.

In Willow class, we have enjoyed drawing pictures of a new heaven and a new earth, which we shared in church today.

This week Larch Class took part in the first of our school harvest services. We imagined the scene as described in the bible of the New Heaven and the New Earth where all people and creatures live in harmony and peace. Some of the class imagined beautiful scenes full of colour and light, whereas others chose to write about people, such as Greta Thunberg and Malala Yousafzai who are already working towards creating such a world.

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What Parents & Carers Need to Know about REGIRATIA

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

SALE Roblex is one of the most popular video games on the market. By 2020, the game's makers were claiming that more than half of children in the USA play it. As a 'sandbox' title, Roblex offers a huge amount of creative freedom: it lets players create their own gaming experiences with the Roblox Studio to build custom levels and games, which can then be shared with other players online. Robiox fosters creative thinking and enjoys a robust online community of fans.

CONTACT WITH STRANGERS

Roblox encourages players to communicate online (including a group chat facility). This could expose children to risks such as scammers, online predators, harassment, griefers and more. The in-game chat has some filters, but isn't perfect: players can still send harmful messages to others – such as general hostility – while predators can reach out to children directly.

PUBLIC SERVERS

oblox has private or VIP servers hich allow people to play exclusively ith their friends, but this costs money. lost Robiox players will instead be on ubic servers that anyone can join. Servers an host games which focus on all kinds of spects, including direct player interaction, ome games and servers, therefore, will put hidren more at risk of contact from transpect than others rangers than others

ONLINE DATERS

These are also called 'ODers' and are quite common in Roblox. An ODer is an individual who joins a game with the intention of finding someone to date online – and eventually meet in person. Such online dating is against the Roblox community guidelines, but this usually doesn't deter ODers. Some player-built Roblox game worlds have even been designed with online dating specifically in mind

IN-APP PURCHASES

Advice for Parents & Carers

SET PARENTAL CONTROLS

Roblox comes with several parental control options, which are explained well on the game's official website. It's essential to enter the correct date of birth for your child, as that allows Roblox to automatically apply the appropriate chat filters. The game also allows parents and corres to set monthly spending restrictions and monitor their child's account.

MONITOR SPENDING

If they don't understand they're using real money, it's easy for children to accidentally spend a sizedble amount in the game. Using parental controls to place limits on their spending will help avoid any nasty financial surprises. Ensuring that you have two-factor authentication on your payment accounts also makes it harder for your child to spend money inadvertently.

DISABLE PRIVATE MESSAGING

Roblox's private messaging function raises the risk of children being contacted by people they may not want to speak with – potentially leading to bullying, harassment, toxicity and scam attempts. The game allows you to disable messages from anyone who hasn't been added as a friend on your child's account. - Cast

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
